The Commission on the Status of Women was established in 1949 by Executive Order of President Truman. It was the first of its kind in the United States. The Commission's mandate was to study the status of women in the United States and to report to the President and Congress. The Commission's report, "The Status of Women in the United States," was published in 1951. It was a landmark document that identified the problems facing women in the United States and proposed solutions. The Commission's work was a significant contribution to the advancement of women's rights in the United States.
